ARROW to Demonstrate Emergency Communications Skills June 25 - 26, 2022

Ann Arbor, MI – Ann Arbor's amateur radio operators will join with thousands of "hams" across North America the weekend of June 25-26, 2022 to demonstrate their emergency communications capabilities. And, the public is invited!

During this annual event, called "Field Day," ARROW, Ann Arbor's amateur radio club will set up and operate amateur radio stations, using only emergency power, near the Ann Arbor Airport, on Airport Boulevard, just south of Ellsworth Road. The public is not only invited to come and watch club members make contacts, but also to participate. One of the stations the club will set up is the "Get on the Air" station, and coaches at this station will show you how to make contacts on your own. They will also provide information on how you can get your own amateur radio license.

More than 40,000 amateur radio operators across the country participated in last year's event. There are over 750,000 Amateur Radio licensees in the US, and more than 2.5 million around the world.
